

Huff Run Watershed Meeting Minutes January 25, 2005

In attendance:

Ed Taggart, Carl Harsha, Judy Rufener, Phil Rufener, Jim Gue, Maureen Wise, Ilona Volker, Mike Farber, Mike Patterson, Merv Burton, and Mike Steinmaus.

Ed Taggart called the meeting to order at 5:35pm.

Minutes

The November Meeting Minutes were approved. Phil motioned, Jim second, and the motion was carried.

Treasurer's Report

Judy gave the treasurer's report: The November balance was \$1,690.05. After paying for Ed's gas receipt, the balance was \$1,621.05. Two memberships were received from the (Kolp and Hysong) along with a donation of \$100. The new treasury balance is \$1,731.05. The Crossroads 319 treasury is \$26,452.40.

Maureen submitted a receipt for carpet cleaning (\$34.22). Ed then submitted a receipt for hotel rooms at the Athens ARC conference. ((they gave me a check.. more paint will be paid for out of petty cash)) Carl motioned, Merv second, and the motion carried.

Watershed Project Update

Jim Gue briefly updated the group about current and future projects.

He spoke about Lyons bid closing on Thursday. He said the project is estimated at \$650,000 for phase 1 surface reconstruction, rock channels, and steel slag treatment.

Lindentree was finished November 15, 2004. It was seeded and ODNR is hoping for good vegetation.

The HR-42/ Fern Hill project does not have a deep mine under it, the acidity is coming from toxic sandstone. A grant proposal for an OSM grant is being submitted to reclaim four pits above the plume which may be contributed to the seepage. The owner has given permission for design to ODNR. They are still testing the water quality.

The Mineral Zoar Design is finished and they are just presently waiting on funding.

Thomas is in the design stage.

Watershed Plan Revision

Maureen stated she would present more detail at the next meeting. She hopes to talk about plans for a public meeting then.

From the tributary sampling there are six new sites determined for future projects. Jim Gue passed around minutes from a meeting about future projects (attached in this email) with specific dates for technical events.

HR 9 needs quantity sampling data and Farr also needs revised flow rates technique.

HR 42 Grant Proposal

Maureen stated that she is working on this proposal for an OSM grant. The landowner has agreed to the project.

Mineral Zoar Grant Proposal

It was submitted by Ilona to OSM and is currently being reviewed.

Lyons Grant Proposal

Nancy Seger requested that a grant proposal be submitted to OSM to supplement ODNR funds to pay for the Lyons project. Rural Action will be administering the grant. Maureen has completed this proposal and sent it on to Rural Action for their additions.

TAC will decide on February 8, 2005 at 10 about future grant proposals.

New Business

Watershed Coordinator Update Maureen stated that Rural Action is the new sponsor of the old watershed coordinator grant. Mineral City Village Council is providing the office space and Phil Rufener and Mayor Terry Nill have donated paint. The carpet has been washed and the phone hooked up. Maureen presented a Wish List of office supplies. It will be posted on the internet.

Phil reported that the MC Village Council agreed to let the Watershed Coordinator move in, but needs to have the contract finished and signed ASAP.

Mike Steinmaus introduced himself and Rural Action, stating that they have 20 employees and 24 VISTAs. Most of the VISTAs are with Forestry and Watershed Groups.

Carl asked what technical support RA can provide and Mike stated:

- Use of RA software
- Computer Repair and Training
- Supplies and Materials
- Display Boards/ Projectors/Cameras
- Meeting Space

- Fiscal Services
- Human Resources
- Training Services/ Community Development/Staff Meetings
- Web Maintenance
- Layout of Newsletters

Mike said that he would sell his old desk to HRWRP. Carl bid \$40 then \$50, Mike accepted. Carl motioned, Phil second, and the motion carried to buy the desk for the Watershed Coordinator's office.

Carl motioned that \$1000 be set aside for the Watershed Coordinator's needs. He suggested paying six months of \$150 rent for the MCVV office space with this money. He also motioned that the American Legion be paid \$250 for use of the meeting space.

Phil motioned, Mike second and the motion carried for the \$1000 along with a donation to the Legion. A subcommittee of the three officers will be in charge of this money.

VISTA Update

Ilona relayed that Nancy and Sandy could not attend due to respective trips for meetings. She invited the group to the Annual Full Council Meeting Feb 11. Maureen and Ed said they were planning on attending. Maureen said she wasn't sure who would pay her admission fee possibly RA. The group decided to have Maureen work on a display for Crossroads Full Council Meeting. Mike Steinmaus of RA will provide the display board.

Future Events

Maureen brought up future events and possible dates and asked the group to decide on them.

The Fun Day will be in August depending on the availability of the pavilion. The Fire Department ((the FD actually helped sponsor it one year. The historical society is not interested in this but will have a booth)) will be invited to partner in the event.

The Awareness Days will be in May, preferably on the 24th depending on the area schools.

The Tree Planting Day is undecided. Maureen will look into finding a place to plant trees. She will get in touch with ODNR/ MRM Regulatory Staff (Chris Stephanoff) to determine were there may be reclaimed land under regulations that may be interested in planting trees. Miller Mining land is a possibility
The Litter Clean Up will be in April.

Watch Dog Program

This will be discussed at the next meeting.

Closing

Ed presented the Award from ODNR received at the ARC.

The next meeting is on Feb 15, 2005. March 10, 2005 is the next South East Ohio Watershed Council Meeting.

Ed Taggart adjourned the meeting at 7:10pm.

E. Taggart called the meeting to order at 5:40.

P. Rufener gave the treasurer's report in J. Rufener's absence. On January 25, 2005 there was \$1,731.05 in the Huff Run account. The following was deducted from the account:

- \$50.00 – Purchase of desk for watershed coordinator
- \$200.00 – American Legion Hall donation for meeting space
- \$34.22 – Carpet cleaning for Huff Run office
- \$84.94- Crossroads Reimbursement for Room at Athens ARC
- \$599.20- Purchase of Copier and Supplies for Huff Run office
- \$53.49- Copier warranty from Staples
- \$53.26- Electric heater from Lowes
- \$33.80- P. Rufener paint and supplies

The following was added to the account:

- \$5 for membership fee
- \$500 donation
- \$25 donation

There is now a total of \$1102.14 in the Huff Run account and an unknown amount in the petty cash (to be counted by Watershed Coordinator).

The last reported figure of the 319 grant is \$26, 452.40 from June 2004. However, that account has been closed out and the new 319 figure has not been reported at the present time.

M. Steinmaus reminded the partnership that their non-profit tax ID number can be used when making purchases to exempt the organization from paying taxes. Either Rural Action or Huff Run should locate their number and have that available for making further purchases for the new office. Mike motioned to accept the treasurer's report and Cheryl seconded. P. Rufener motioned to accept the January meeting minutes (changing the \$26,000 in the Huff Run account), M. Farber seconded.

Cheryl Socotch reported on projects:

Lyons site has been bid to Malcuit Inc. The CSX right of entry process has been difficult, and ODNR is considering using 'police power'. The same is true for the Mineral Zoar site.

Buckeye Industrial is doing more testing for remining on the Thomas site. There are remaining 319 funds \$216, 000 for construction of the Thomas site (subject to change due to watershed coordinator contract).

Cheryl reported having completed lots of sampling especially on the tributary sites with Jim Gue, Maureen Wise, and Ilona Volker.

Maureen Wise reported about grant funding:

An OSM Clean Streams grant has been completed for Lyons and is being reviewed by Rural Action. Another one for HR42 is close to being completed. The HRWRP has decided to take on the administrative responsibility for this grant. This grant proposes to eliminate the acid ponds first and then treat the drainage at HR42. C.Harsha moved to take responsibility for this grant. P. Rufener seconded.

Watchdog Program:

Ilona Volker will contact approximately six agencies about the complaint list including: Carroll SWCD, Tusc SWCD, Army Corps of Engineers, ODNR, USDA, EPA, Div of Wildlife, and Litter & Recycling. She will discover what complaints they can handle and what the procedure is for complaints.

C. Harsha asked about 'scenic river,' 'protected,' or 'national heritage area'. S. Chenal spoke on the subject and suggested possibly inviting a speaker from Columbiana County to present the group with more information.

Watershed Plan:

M. Wise presented the six issues of the watershed plan: AMD, sewage, illegal dumping, oil & gas, and agriculture.

No changes were made to the AMD plan except adding projects and including wildlife plantings.

It was decided that the illegal dumping is very stable and no new dumping of a large magnitude is occurring except at the small dump across from the Farr project.

A study was done by ATC Consulting on the illegal dump sites when Harsha North studies were completed including weight & cost for elimination. M. Wise is working with landfills to clean this up and use the estimates as a base for future clean up.

As far as riparian corridors, the plan is to work with Carroll SWCD and NRCS, research available programs, and identify potential easement holders.

The sewer systems will be upgraded within Mineral City Corporation limits. Carroll County is the target of septic problems and upgrades. There is no funding presently, but it could possibly be written into the next 319 grant. Stillwater and Sunday Creeks have gotten funding through 319 grants. The watershed coordinator will find out more information about how this was done from those groups.

Agricultural problems are fairly limited, mostly to Carroll County. A public meeting is not needed to address the issue, as house calls are sufficient.

Oil & Gas well problems are mainly unknown with one orphan well but on the Orphan Well list to be removed. There are more than likely many more abandoned wells. The Watershed Coordinator will gather mapping information from the Oil & Gas companies and look into the relation to groundwater problems.

Future Event Dates

The Public Meeting about the Watershed Plan will be held at the Fire Hall (March 29, or 31) to collect citizen comments.

The 319 grant is due in June. It should be submitted in May for review.

May 24th is the date of the Awareness day. The Fun Day is scheduled for either August 20th or 27th.

Commissioners meetings are going to be March 3(Tuscarawas). and March 7 (Carroll).

VISTA Update

The VISTA reported having set up two outreach events and continuing work on the database. She is looking into getting the final product on the webpage. She will obtain an estimate and submit it to ODNR.

319 Update

Nancy Summers gave an update on the "new" million dollar 319 grant. Since Rural Action is the new sponsor of the Huff Run Coordinator grant, Crossroads has contracted with them to produce the deliverables of the grant (apart from

reclamation work) such as supervision, the Fun Day, the Awareness Day, webpage maintenance etc. The total came to \$65,023, which does include match for the Coordinator salary as well.

HRWRP Office Sign

The Watershed Coordinator thanked all who helped with the move to the office. It was decided that she should get a sign by her door. Estimates for such a sign are around \$150.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 15, 2005.

E. Taggart closed the meeting. The meeting was closed at 7:45.

Meeting called to Order at 5:37p.m. by President Ed Taggart

Meeting minutes approved, 1st Carl, 2nd Cheryl, motion carried

Treasurer's Report- Current Balance \$1102.14 (a \$5 membership and \$15 donation) plus \$50 petty cash, 1st Phil, 2nd Carl, motion carried

Introduction of Jane Forrest Redfern, Executive Director of Rural Action. Jane explained what Rural Action does and the role they are playing in this partnership. She suggested that a M.O.U. (Memorandum of Understanding) be drawn up between Rural Action and HRWRP. A sub committee of Carl, Bo, Ed and Maureen, will work on the MOU. Jane has a draft and will meet 3/23/05 at Maureen's office to finalize. Rural Action has a signed agreement with Rosida Porter for the Watershed Coordinator Grant to help secure Maureen's position for the next 18 months. The chain of command will be as follows: HRWRP goes to Maureen, next to Mike and then to Jane.

Dump Site Maps- Illegal dumping sites. Maureen and Ed have tried to locate some on the maps. Carroll County has recently indicated any known sites on this current map also.

Old Business-

*August 27, 2005 will be the Fun Day. The Mineral City Fire Department will co-sponsor and Maureen will represent the HRWRP.

*5-K got about \$500 in cash donated and door prizes last year. Phil and Maureen to assist with this year's solicitation of gifts. The Tusky Valley Challenge- for a donation of \$50 this group will promote our 5-K run and bring their running groups to our event. A motion was made by Carl Harsha and seconded by Phil Rufner to proceed with this option. Motion carried.

*Photo Contest- Theme/ Hope for Huff Run? There is not cost to the partnership to conduct this contest.

*Litter Pick Up Day- April 23rd, "Clean Sweep Day" picking up trash throughout Sandy township. The HRWRP is being asked to participate with the local township trustees on Clean Sweep Day. The trustees will provide bags and will collect the filled bags after the pick up at the recycling office. The hours will be from 8 a.m. to Noon. Hot dogs and drinks to be supplied. Possible work with Carroll County Litter also to cover other areas not included in Sandy Twp. Maureen to talk with Julie at Litter Prevention.

*Watershed Planning Meeting will be March 29th. This is a public meeting that will start at 6:30 p.m. Coffee, drinks and cookies will be provided by Maureen, Cheryl and Carl. Flyers will be distributed and placed on the community board. Maureen will do a PowerPoint presentation.

New Business-

Project Updates- per Cheryl and Jim

Farr- Collecting flow rates from the site. A possibility of recycling metals (irons).

Mineral-Zoar Road- grants discussed, total costs of HR42 and Mineral-Zoar is \$102,000. Max Luehrs said grants could not exceed \$100,000

Lyons- Contracted with Mauket Inc. from Strausburg. Bid was \$615,000. Contract to be issued next month. Pre-construction meeting will be scheduled soon date to be announced probably in April. Construction to begin 10 days after the contract is signed. Pre-Construction sampling is needed by ODNR- the railroad bed (approximately 2 acres) may have to be eliminated because of contractual differences.

HR-42- (Fern Hill) grants discussed

Coordinator Advisory Committee- to be formed as a support committee for the Watershed Coordinator Position. Mike S. wants to have local support for Maureen. Those serving will be Carl Harsha from HRWRP, Jim Gue from ODNR and Nancy Summers from Crossroads RC&D. What are the goals of this committee? Mike to create a one page job description for Maureen. A sub

committee of the Advisory Committee is the Personnel Committee and Carl, Nancy and a Rural Action representative.

New 319 Grants- due out by March 31, 2005, must be submitted by May 31, can apply once a year for a maximum of \$400,000. AMD projects will be competing against each other, a possibility of only one AMD project awarded. Projects with complete design and that are ready for construction will probably get priority placement. Monitoring plans and site management is critical. Maybe have an Advisory Committee list the goals of the group. We need to track improvements within the watershed. Local match is critical. Jane said that Rural Actions attorney suggested HRWRP keep their funding separate. Rural Action will keep 20% of all fund raising that Maureen is involved with like the 5K run. From now on all grants would go through Rural Action per Jane. Carl objected to this comment. Crossroads RC&D was mentioned as another candidate to write and administer 319 grants for the partnership. Nancy told the partnership that Crossroads RC&D would not be competing with RA for 319 grant monies. Nancy also stated that the Crossroads RC&D VISTA would continue to assist the partnership in the following areas. A data base for monitoring, assist with water sampling/monitoring one day per month and continue to map GPS sites for the project. HRWRP has not liability insurance because of the group's lack of funds. Rural Action has full liability insurance. If the partnership (HRWRP) writes a grant Maureen is not to be working on it unless there is an agreement with RA for 319 grant money. Harry will meet with RA, HRWRP, or Crossroads RC&D at any time if necessary for clarification on where ODNR stands on 319 grants.

Waste Management Partnership- will pay \$10,000 per year for inspection of easement rights. The partnership feels they need more details. Maureen to follow up.

Rural Action will be applying for a VISTA to work totally with the Watershed Coordinator and HR. Jane explained the plan.

Mike S. suggested that Maureen write a letter to the local department of transportation to help with grant monies and explain the good work the HRWRP has done.

Rural Action and Crossroads RC&D agreement. Crossroads RC&D's policy manual states that all contracts over \$15,000 need to have three bids submitted. Dan Imhoff said that this is the policy that should be followed. Harry Payne said we could proceed without the bids.

Meeting adjourned 8:15 p.m. by President Ed.

Ed Taggart called the meeting to order at 5:33pm

Judy Rufener gave the Treasurer's Report

In HRWRP account: \$1,122.14

Do not have quorum to approve report

New Business

Waste Management: The manager at the landfill has not gotten back to M. Wise about the easement inspection checklist despite emails and voice messages left. E. Taggart and C. Harsha brought up that neither of them are sure that the HRWRP should peruse this partnership because it may make the group look bad especially with another citizen's group opposing the expansion. The group agreed to keep an open mind but not take any further action.

Also, Waste Management has committed to free illegal dump disposal in Huff Run (although not in writing yet, another issue they have not responded to emails or voice mails about). They will not help with removal or transportation. A condition with their help is that the landowner of the illegal dump may not sell the land for 15 years.

Finally, Waste Management has also agreed to give a lower price for waste removal at Harsha North since ODNR has agreed to pay up to \$25,000 for it.

VISTA: M. Wise passed out an information sheet about the VISTA we are hoping to hire. Applications are due by May 7 with a hire date by May 20. M. Wise, C. Harsha or P. Rufener and E. Taggart are to conduct interviews. M. Wise asked the group to search for cheap housing for the VISTA. C. Harsha asked that we put an ad in local papers with the HRWRP to pay for it. M. Steinmaus brought up the idea of eventually renting/ leasing/ buying a house for the HRWRP office that could also serve as a cheap rental for a VISTA. M. Wise will be the sole supervisor of the VISTA.

Advisory Committee: M. Steinmaus asked that an Advisory Committee be held directly before the next HRWRP meeting on May 17 at 4:30pm. He will email Nancy Summers and Jim Gue.

Old Business:

Project Update: Two grants from OSM have been approved this month: Mineral Zoar Rd Project with Crossroads RC&D administering and HR-42/ Fern Hill with HRWRP administering.

The Lyons project will be under construction within the next few weeks. A contract was signed with the contractor on 4/18/05. Police power will probably have to be used against CXS.

Harsha North design is 50% completed.

Upcoming Grants: This summer, the HR TAC is putting together two grants: a US EPA Targeted Watershed grant proposal and a 319 Grant proposal. The Targeted grant would be written for the Belden Project, 15% admin (what the EPA wants administers to write in), Fun Days, Awareness Days etc plus some extra new HR brochures. The 319 grant will also cover all the Fun Days/ Awareness Days etc (in case we do not get the Targeted grant) plus HR-7, HR-9, Lindentree Phase II and Acid Pit Phase II. C. Harsha stated that the owner of Belden (R.L. James) thought that the project was dead and needs to be informed. M. Wise said she would contact him.

C. Harsha asked if there would be any biological studies done this summer to learn how the stream has been reacting to the new projects. M. Wise said that no, MUC does not have any students that will be conducting senior projects in Huff Run soon. She said that ILGARD might however be under contract with ODNR/ MRM to do some biological studies at each Reach in Huff Run if the contract goes through. It was agreed that we do need some new studies soon.

Watershed Meeting Results: M. Wise asked that the members present rank action items again because most groups at the Watershed Planning meeting did not finish. The Severity List is as follows:

Because of the meeting, one new member joined.

Awareness Day: M. Wise asked that volunteers help with the Awareness Day on May 24. So far, there is a large group of home school students, and two classes

from Sherodsville elementary school. M.Wise will be on vacation this week and unfortunately will not be able to be there to help.

Voting: At the July meeting we will have voting for President and Secretary. Be ready to nominate in June. Ideas of changing the voting procedures were brought up: vote by slips of paper instead of show of hands. A possibility.

Other discussions:

The group should conduct another watershed tour this fall and try to do one every other year. M. Steinmaus suggested that we seek funding from T.J. Justice for bussing and food. We will talk more about this in June.

E. Taggart said that Dick Kellicker brought a new seep behind this house to the attention of E. Taggart and Jim Gue. He and Jim went to investigate. It is a very deep seep with a pH of 4. It may be running along a pipeline from newly created beaver pits north on Hope Rd.

M. Wise requested that the HRWRP pay for her to attend a conference on stream morphology for \$120. Rosida will give her a scholarship for the rest of the funds. Two books are included in the cost. It is a one-day meeting in June. The group agreed.

The Litter Pick Up Day is this Saturday. Meet at the Village Hall at nine.

The MOU with Rural Action should be completed shortly.

E. Taggart presented correspondence: a request to renew membership with Crossroads RC&D and a solicitation to attend a conference in Louisville, KY.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45pm.

Jim Toms made a motion to approve. Carl Harsha seconded. Approved.

Old Business

Awareness Day will be held on May 24 next Tuesday. Many HRWRP members have volunteered to help: Jim Toms, Carl Harsha, Ed Taggart, Phil Rufener, Merv Burton, Bo Hysong along with Jim Gue to conduct a site tour, Cheryl Socotch to conduct a water chemistry demo, Shirley Everhart to conduct an enviroscape demo and Kelly Capuzzi (OEPA) to conduct a macroinvertebrate demonstration.

Maureen Wise announced that a new VISTA was hired: Terri Sponaugle-Shrock who is from the area and knows people in the HRWRP. Interviews were held last week. Terri will start mid July.

Mike Steinmaus apologized that the Advisory Committee meeting was not held tonight. It will be postponed until next month to be held at 5pm before the regular meeting.

Jane Forrest-Redfern reported that the MOU between Rural Action and the HRWRP has been completed. She covered the changes made which include further detail about the services that Rural Action will provide and that modifications can be made annually. Jane asked if the MOU could be signed that night but the committee that reviewed it previously wanted to take a look at it

again. A conversation ensued about liability insurance and Jane said she would check if the group could be underwritten into RA's insurance.

New Business

Jim Gue gave a project update.

The Lyons project has begun construction. He reports that there are two D9s on the site clearing the area and further earth moving will start next week. Jim sends Maureen and others reports with pictures each time he conducts an inspection. Maureen will put these pictures on the website for members to see.

The contractor is scheduled to start repairs to the Lindentree project soon.

Tree planting at the Acid Pit project, Farr and the Huff Run AML project were finished this spring.

Thomas is still under design.

Mining companies are still looking at Harsha North for mining, slowing down progress with the project. Carl Harsha asked if he could remove the flagging for utilities and Maureen Wise said that it has been documented and to take them out.

RA/HRWRP MOU: Carl and Bo met with Mike Steinmaus at the last meeting to discuss some minor changes in the MOU. We are waiting to hear back from Rural Action.

Insurance Letter: Maureen received a letter from RA's insurance company that day about how the HRWRP can't be a rider on RA's insurance. She read the letter to the group. It did not clarify that if an event or project is organized by an RA employee (Maureen or Terri) that the event will be covered by their insurance. Maureen is to contact RA again to ask for an additional letter.

NEW BUSINESS

Project Update: Cheryl gave a brief update about the Lyons project. Two impoundments have been eliminated and a lot of soil has been moved around. There have been some problems with the amount of trees removed. Usually, all the trees are piled up on the edges of the site for wildlife habitat but there are limestone channels on the edges of this site. A chipper has been hired to chip most of the trees. Jim (through Maureen) reports that 75% of the earthwork is done and that the project is ahead of schedule.

Again, out of order, Maureen announced that there will be an exclusive tour of the Lyons project for HRWRP members that following Thursday. Meet Jim Gue, Maureen and Terri (the new VISTA) at the Village Café at noon for lunch and with the tour starting at 1:00.

Recycling Ink Cartridges: Maureen has been doing some research on free fundraising. One of the easiest fundraisers is to collect ink cartridges and send them to companies who recycle them. They pay between \$1 and \$12 (unusual) per cartridge. We would ship them back to the companies for free and get a check cut each time we send them in. Maureen's husband's company has

already committed to donating their cartridges. Maureen asked that all members turn in theirs to the HRWRP office and ask other people to as well as look for additional companies to help out. The printer cartridges at the HRWRP office will be turned in for \$1. They also take cell phones. We will have to give \$20 of this to Rural Action.

Illegal Dumping: Maureen reminded the group that illegal dumping is the number two priority in the watershed after the new prioritizing we did at the Watershed Planning meeting. She may have found some funders to clean up dumps in Tuscarawas County and will continue looking for others. In addition to cleaning up dumps, the plan includes promoting recycling in the area. There are recycling drop off sites at the Sandy Township garage (which takes aluminum, plastic, cardboard, and glass) and Pike Township garage (which takes the afore mentioned products plus paper). Maureen has also found a web group in the area called Freecycle where people trade items instead of throwing them into a landfill. Maureen signed up the HRWRP to be part of the group. If anyone would like to participate, contact Maureen or visit their website (there is a link off the Huff Run site). Mike Steinmaus said that we should have a press release about this as well.

Taggart comes to an agreement and the MOU is changed to reflect this, that the MOU be signed. P. Rufener seconded. Accepted.

New Business

Coordinator's Report M. Wise reported that she is changing the format of the Coordinator's Report. She has been told that a listing of what she is doing has not been sufficient for members. She will not put it into calendar form and disperse at the meetings.

Office Announcement M. Wise announced that the HRWRP office will be moving to the front offices of the former Mineral City Village Hall. The Council meeting rooms and offices will be moved to the new library. They need someone to take care of paying for utilities for the Village Hall building. We were offered a lease of \$1 per year if we could cover utilities – water, electricity, gas, phone plus reimburse them for structural insurance. M. Wise had been given estimates on costs for utilities and they will work with what has been budgeted in grants. C. Harsha was concerned about RA's liability insurance covering a government building. E. Taggart put C. Harsha and P. Rufener in charge of attending MCVC meetings and obtaining he lease agreement.

Grant Update M. Wise gave updates on grants. She stated that our Ohio EPA 319 grant that was pending since the summer was not accepted due to ODNR/MRM match falling through. She also said that she is working on a grant for Harsha North from OSM's Appalachian Clean Stream Initiative Program. She also excitedly announced that Rural Action and HRWRP were awarded the US EPA Targeted Watershed Grant we applied for this past summer. Only 12 grants were given in the nation! They are awarding a total of \$711,301 with ODNR/MRM match of \$299,593. This will fund our Belden project, environmental education such as Fun Day, Awareness Day, school programs, office supplies and equipment as well as Maureen's salary through 2008. No details have been given yet.

December Meeting M. Wise asked if we wanted to have a meeting in December. Many years the group has elected to not have a meeting because the meeting date was too close to Christmas. The body decided to have a meeting if needed only to discuss the lease agreement and office move.

December Conferences M. Wise told the group that she and T. Sponaugle-Schrock would be out of office quite a bit in December due to many meetings and conferences. They would be attending a meeting of the SE Ohio Watershed Council on Dec 6, ODNR/MRM's Applied Research Conference Dec 7 & 8, and a sampling training on Dec 13 & 14. Also, all RA employees are given December 26 through Dec 30 off.

Project Update M. Wise gave a project update in Jim Gue and Cheryl Socotch's absence. She said that the coal company interested in Harsha North has decided that they are no longer interested in the land because they have determined there is no coal. Since this word has been given,

ODNR/MRM has moved ahead with the Harsha North project. Also, the Lyons project construction has been extended into December.

At this point, the group moved away from the agenda and E. Taggart told the group that a few people from ODNR/ Soil and Water who administer the Watershed Coordinator grants would be attending a personal tour with M. Wise and T. Sponaugle-Schrock in a few weeks. A new person has been hired to replace Rosida and she will be attending.

M. Wise gave a message from Mike Steinmaus that he was sorry that this was the third meeting he could not attend.

P. Rufener asked if our meeting space would be changed to the new office once we have moved. We would need to obtain new tables and chairs. C. Harsha said that we should do it after the signs are changed and we should have an open house.

Business

Establishment of HRWRP office in former Mineral City Village Hall Offices

Carl Harsha and Maureen Wise gave background information as follows:

Three Wishes show came to Mineral City and erected a new library. The Village of Mineral City cannot afford to keep both buildings – their current Village Hall and the library. They are moving their offices and meeting space into the library conference room. Because the HRWRP was leasing the back of the building, they were given preference for leasing the front office space. If a lease is accepted, it will only be for \$1/ year but we must also pay for all utilities and insurance. The Mineral City Village Council prefers to lease to HRWRP instead of RA because they are local. It has been proposed that a joint lease be written up. The Council agreed to this but did not vote on it.

Discussion continued about insurance issues. C. Harsha was unsure if RA's liability insurance would be sufficient for a government owned building. No one was sure if the City was keeping their structural and liability insurance and we were reimbursing or if HRWRP/ RA had to obtain new insurance for the building. C. Harsha had done some research about HRWRP obtaining both insurance types on the building if RA could not find the correct kind. Time is of the essence.

Bo Hysong motioned to accept a partnership with RA to lease the office space contingent on necessary liability insurance. The body voted unanimously.

Phil Rufener was to obtain the lease agreement from the solicitor. The group agreed to let P. Rufener, C. Harsha, E. Taggart and B. Hysong review the lease and accept it without the rest of the body reviewing it. P. Rufener would give it to M. Wise who would fax copies to B. Hysong and distribute via postal mail otherwise.

B. Hysong also motioned to let C. Harsha and E. Taggart accept the lease at the MCVC meeting. The body voted unanimously.

M. Wise was also to obtain proof of liability insurance from RA and give to P. Rufener who would give to the Council.

C. Harsha asked if the group would be interested in researching and obtaining Directors and Officers' insurance. C. Harsha made a motion. G. Beatty seconded. The group voted unanimously.

E. Taggart closed the meeting at 7:00pm.
